


- critical to get **outcomes right** (granularity, narrative)
- support for specific outcomes on essential 'heath systems capacities'
- outcomes need to **reflect role of health sector** (& *unique contribution of WHO*)
- need reflect **key cross-cutting themes** that impact multiple outcomes *(e.g. GER, equity, AMR)*
- need to enunciate WHO contributions (outputs) & value add (ToC) in wider ecosystem



Since last Member State Consultation

WHO **3-level Working Groups** have developed a draft **scope** for each GPW14 strategic objective & proposed **outcomes**, as well as major **shifts** and **actions** needed by key **stakeholders**

4. does it reflect how global health architecture is organized?



Issue – outcome definition doesn't reflect vital health system capacities



Proposal for GPW14

Complement 'health outcomes' with specific outcomes for essential health system capacities

Health outcomes

Measurable change in an **individual's or population's health status**, resulting from healthcare interventions, treatments, lifestyle choices, or environmental factors



Health system outcomes

Measurable change in **essential capacities or aspects of a health system** to enable the equitable delivery of quality health interventions & services without financial hardship


